Follow I-10 E to I-10 Frontage Rd in Marana.

Take exit 250 from I-10 E – 1 h 26 min (102 mi)

Take exit 250 toward Orange Grove Road – 0.2 mi

Use the left 2 lanes to turn left on W Orange Grove Rd – 0.3 mi

Turn right toward W River Rd at N. Thornydale Rd.

Take W River Rd to your destination:

Get on I-10 W
