June 5-7, 2014

The thirty-sixth annual Spring Conference, Golden West Region (GWR), Soroptimist International of the Americas, Inc. (SIA), was held at the Wild Horse Pass Hotel and Casino, Chandler, AZ on June 5-7, 2014.

THURSDAY, JUNE 5, 2014

The 2014 Spring Conference commenced with the Registration process for members and guests beginning at 2:00pm. A reunion of GWR DIVAs, REGALs and DOÑAs was held in the Classics lounge from 5-6pm followed by a Meet & Greet reception for all members. At 7:00pm, Cyndi Monroe, SI Corona, served as mistress of ceremony for the Governor's Appreciation Dinner. Recognition certificates were distributed to 2012-2014 committee members and Board Members during a high energy atmosphere involving beach balls, bubbles, and clappers.

FRIDAY, JUNE 6, 2014

Registration for members attending the conference began at 7:00am. Interested members participated in an art project led by Ann Rice, SI Saguaro Foothills, and her friend/fellow artist Lee Anne Park to create a garden painting that incorporated brooches donated by club members. The painting called "The Garden of Hope" was then auctioned at the Celebrating Soroptimist Banquet with the proceeds allocated to the 2014-2015 GWR Service Fund.

Registration and Exhibit Room set-up opened at 7:00am. DOÑA Fran Ballard-Miller, parliamentarian, SI San Jacinto-Hemet Valley, and Margie Burke, Laws & Resolutions Committee Coordinator, SI Phoenix, led the Delegates Briefing which began at 8:00am.

OPENING SESSION

The opening session was called to order at 9:00am by Debbie-Dematteis-Miller, Spring Conference Coordinator, SI Corona, followed by a procession of GWR DOÑAs and the GWR Board. Presentation of the Flags and the Pledge of Allegiance was conducted by the Chandler, Arizona Girl Scout Troop #604.

CALL TO CONFERENCE, INSPIRATION, AND WELCOME

Governor Linda welcomed the attendees to the conference and introduced Karina Bland, columnist for the Arizona Republic Newspaper, who complemented the members with her comments that women volunteers are committed to improving lives and busy women do not say no.

GWR Secretary Penny Babb, SI Happy Valley, read the Call to Conference.

Governor Linda Nixon, SI San Jacinto-Hemet Valley, provided an overview of the 2012-2014 Biennium which included: the 2012-2014 GWR Board installation theme of the Happiest Place on Earth; increased communications with members included the unveiling of a new GWR website in 2012 which was restructured in 2013, directed content in the website newsletter, held two Town Hall electronic meetings, held conference calls with club leaders, produced a Little Black Book of Fundraising, updated and separated the SIA Club Guide into the New Member Handbook and the Club Management Guide, produced a video of GWR members sharing thoughts of Soroptimist membership, and held meetings using Skype and GoToMeeting; offered a Leadership Training Retreat theme of Creating Happiness

utilizing the Zappos.com leadership book; distributed new messages such as We Are Soroptimist Rising, Shaping the Future, Be the Wave of Change and Increased Collective Impact; clubs continued to participate in WOA at 100% and participation in Club Giving increased to 80%; and SIA presented GWR with the 1st Place award in Program and Honorable Mention in Public Awareness in 2013.

Poco Davis, SIA President-elect, SIA Official Visitor, SI Metropolitan Las Vegas, presented the SIA message "Wishbone, Backbone, and Funny Bone." The new name for Women's Opportunity Award will be Live Your Dream Education & Training Award for Women. During the 2014 SIA Convention, members will be presented with a request for a dues increase. Mail ballots will be sent to the SIA clubs in good standing.

FIRST TIME ATTENDEES RECOGNITION

District 3 Director Mandy Mann, SI Flagstaff, and her fellow District Directors recognized members who were attending the spring conference for the first time as "New-bees" with a flower & bee pin.

WORKSHOP #2

Governor Linda presented "Soroptimist Smart Projects" to the assembly. The GWR Saturday of Service Task Force developed an outline for organizing successful Soroptimist projects which was distributed to the members. After hearing a presentation by GWR Treasurer Lori Reed, SI Phoenix, on the Soroptimist mission, members were asked to complete the outline with a project to address community need and the Soroptimist mission. The members were further asked to complete the outline with advantages of developing partnerships and to utilize the outline when developing future projects.

FIRST BUSINESS SESSION

GWR Governor Linda Nixon called the first business session to order at 3:45pm. Governor-elect Sandi Cvercko provided the inspiration.

FIRST CREDENTIALS REPORT

Credentials & Elections Committee Coordinator, Betty Covel, SI Blythe, presented the first credentials report based on registration at 3:26pm on June 6, 2014. The total registration was 308 with a voting strength of 141 members. Coordinator Betty Covel moved adoption of the report as presented. GWR Secretary Penny Babb stated that every delegate had been provided with a copy of the standing rules in the GWR Spring Conference program on page 12 and also in the Call to Conference. Without objection, Governor Linda declared the Standing Rules adopted as printed in the program.

Secretary Penny then announced that each attendee was given a copy of the Official Program and asked if there were any content corrections. Corrections of changing 2013 to 2014 were identified. Secretary Penny moved the adoption of the program as corrected. Without objection, Governor Linda declared the Official Program adopted as corrected.

Index #1. Proposed Amendment to Region Bylaws, Section 7.5 Voting Members.

Current Bylaws read:

The voting members of the conference shall be the GWR officers, district directors, past governors of the GWR who are members of a club within the GWR and the three accredited delegates of each club in good standing. In order to be in good standing, a club must maintain 15 or more regular members and remain current in all financial obligations to the GWR and SIA.

Proposed change:

The voting members of the conference shall be the GWR officers, district directors, past governors of the GWR who are members of a club within the GWR and the three accredited delegates of each club in good standing with SIA.

Proposed by: GWR Board

Reason Given: SIA no longer requires clubs to maintain 15 or more regular members to be in good standing. In addition, instead of restating the new SIA Procedures definition of a club in good standing in the region bylaws, this section now only references "in good standing with SIA". This change will eliminate the need to change the region bylaws should the SIA Board make future amendments to the SIA Procedures related to the definition of a club in good standing.

Margie moved for adoption. As this recommendation came from the committee, no second was required. The members voted unanimously to approve the index.

She noted that the current assets would be reduced as some expenses for the biennium were paid in the last quarter of the fiscal year, including spring conference expenses and reimbursement requests from region board members and committee coordinators. She also reminded the membership that the Service Fund is based on funds available on March 31, 2014 but the Awards distributed during the Spring Conference will deplete the Service Fund account. There were no questions or discussions from the members. The report will be filed for audit purposes.

She advised that it is the responsibility of the Finance Committee to work with the GWR Treasurer to review the quarterly financials and develop the proposed budget for GWR. Coordinator Barbara reported that quarterly financials were reviewed by the committee and she met with the GWR Board to develop the proposed budget for GWR for 2014-2015. She stressed that the GWR Board and the GWR committees are all very cost conscientious in all of their expenditures. The General Fund is based on all regular members which was estimated as 1225. The Designated and Service Funds are based on all members which was estimated as 1325.

Coordinator Barbara presented the recommendation of the Finance Committee to move for the adoption of the 2014-2015 proposed budget which was distributed in the Call to Conference. There were no questions or discussions, and the members approved the 2014-2015 GWR budget.

LIVE YOUR DREAM LUNCHEON

GWR Program Chair Carol Roddy, SI Chino-Hills-Inland Empire, hosted the Soroptimist Award ceremony. She announced that GWR clubs honored 35 Violet Richardson Award girls and awarded \$19,000 to the girls and their organizations. GWR clubs honored 16 women with the Ruby Award and donated \$3,000 to their organizations. All 53 GWR clubs (100%) recognized women in the community with the Women's Opportunity Award; 75 women were awarded nearly \$90,000.

GWR Fundraising Chair, Laurie Moses, announced that the GWR has 23 members who belong to Laurel Legacy and 210 members who are in Laurel Society. Throughout the conference, her committee was collecting chances to win a Laurel Society membership. The winners of the Laurel Society Drawing were:

- Tanya Hiatt from SI Flagstaff
- Mary Ellen Crane from SI San Tans

Although funds were still being collected, Laurie projected the proceeds for all GWR Fundraising efforts to be \$9,331. Those funds are allocated to the GWR Service Fund from which the 2015 Soroptimist Awards will be distributed to finalists and recipients.

Laurie announced that 43 of 53 GWR clubs donated to Club Giving for a total of \$37,794.24 and 25 of those clubs designated that it was 10% of funds raised by club. She stated that District 1 had 100% participation in Club Giving. For the past twelve years, GWR has had 100% participation in Founders Pennies. However, this past year, two clubs did not contribute. Fifty-one clubs donated \$6,953.56 to Founders Pennies.

SIA CELEBRATING SUCCESS AWARDS

Governor Linda and SIA President-elect Poco Davis presented the SIA Celebrating Success Awards which are given by SIA to recognize club projects that improve the lives of women and girls or that promote Soroptimist as an organization that improves the lives of women and girls. This award celebrates the best practices of Soroptimist clubs in the four pillar areas: fundraising, membership, program and public awareness.

- Fundraising SI the Arizona Peaks Sip-N-Stroll event
- Membership SI Corona Inspiring Women Through Soroptimism
- Program SI the Arizona Peaks Hope's Closet
- Public Awareness SI Moreno Valley Human Trafficking Awareness

These four GWR finalists were automatically advanced to the federation-level judging. Entries from region finalists from all 28 regions have been reviewed, and the top entry in each of the four categories will be announced at the 43rd Biennial Convention in Vancouver in July 2014.
